**RE: Trinity Western University ("TWU") School of Law**

Thank you for your letters of February 10 and February 18, 2014.

As indicated in our letter of February 4, we very much appreciate the opportunity to meet directly with the NSBS Executive Committee on March 4. I have been able to arrange my schedule to come to Halifax on that day and look forward to meeting with you and the rest of the Executive Committee then. I will have two other representatives from TWU with me. I expect that we will need at least half a day for our discussion, during which time TWU can make submissions to the Executive Committee and also answer any questions or concerns that members of the Executive Committee may have.

As I noted in my February 4 letter, TWU will also be providing written submissions prior to the March 4 meeting. We will provide those to you, for distribution to the NSBS Executive Committee, in advance of the March 4 date as we are able.

I must admit that TWU still does not understand the nature of the decision that the NSBS Executive Committee is contemplating. Our letter of February 4 was intended to seek some clarification in that regard. Our reading of Regulations 3.1 and 3.3 is that applicants for enrolment must have a "law degree", which is defined as a "bachelor of laws degree or a juris doctor from a faculty of common law at a Canadian university approved by the Federation..." As you know TWU's School of Law has received the Federation's approval, which is why we articulated our question in the manner that we did. It may simply be that there is no specific motion under contemplation by the NSBS at this time and from your letters we assume that this is the case.

In your letter of February 10, you indicated that you would provide a statement of the public and other issues that will be considered by the NSBS no later than February 18. I understand from your letter of February 18 that you would instead like TWU to respond to all issues raised in the written and oral submissions. As you know, there is a vast quantity of material and we will do our best to anticipate the issues raised by the various parties that are of greatest concern or interest to the NSBS. Again, if there are issues or arguments of particular concern or interest to the NSBS, or that you anticipate will form the primary basis of whatever determination the NSBS will contemplate and decide, I would appreciate that information as soon as possible so that TWU can appropriately respond to the same.

In any event, I look forward to meeting you and the rest of the NSBS Executive Committee on March 4.
